CAA DRIVER PROFICIENCY PROGRAM

Driver Evaluation April 12, 2025

Valkyries Haven, Paris KY

The Driver Proficiency Program is based upon an increasing set of skills regarding safety and commonsense horsemanship as relates to driving. It covers choosing, fitting and maintaining the correct harness and vehicle; balancing a cart; grooming and care of the equine; and safe driving practices. A study syllabus is available for each of the three levels. The program has been adapted by the Carriage Association of America (CAA) from the well-recognized British Driving Society's evaluation program.

If you already care for your horse (pony/donkey/mule), harness it, put to the carriage and drive, then you are well on your way to being ready for Level 1 of the program!

To further your knowledge of basic driving skills and safety, you will need to do the following;

- 1) Order the Level 1 & Road Driving syllabus from the CAA (cost \$18.00 plus postage) www.caaonline.com or call CAA office at 859-231-0971.
- 2) Study the syllabus. If you drive, you will already know much of the material. Other information that you'll need to know is readily available from books or internet sources. Practice.
- 3) Although not required, taking a lesson or clinic with Driver Proficiency Instructor is very helpful! You'll have a chance to review your skills and understand more about how an evaluation will go. A list of Instructors and Evaluators is maintained on the CAA website (www.caaonline.com).
- 4) If you would like to participate in the CAA Evaluation at Valkyries Haven on Apr 12, contact Ann Katona at katdogpony@gmail.com.
- 5) When you are ready, submit your fee and application form for evaluation to the CAA and schedule your evaluation. The Level 1 and Road Driving evaluation takes about 90 minutes.

February 9, 2025 meeting - Harness Care & Cleaning

Terry Shaw kindly joined us in order to share his knowledge and expertise in caring for our harnesses. Terry has a wealth of information, having started in 1980 with various aspects of driving. Notably Coaching in the USA and Canada. Terry has worked with beautiful turnouts; Hackneys, Gelderlanders, 4-In-Hand, Unicorn, Gigs, at prestigious events such as Walnut Hill and Toronto. This at a time when it was not unusual to see 12 -15 coaches turned out. Terry has followed details of proper turnout & presentation traditions from over 100 years ago.

Some highlights of this presentation:

- With the Harness, one should never use the last hole; that is telling the judge that your harness doesn't fit properly as well as a safety concern
- Cleaning the harness removes Mud, Sweat, hair, etc. Use warm water and a sponge with Murphy's Oil soap to cut through the grime.
- Polish the Harness with a good wax shoe polish. Best method is elbow grease! If one's harness is conditioned well it is easier to clean.
- Condition with Saddle Soap; take the harness apart and also check stitching. Document the hole setting (count the holes from the point and jot this down on a piece of paper as you take the harness apart)
- Keep a nail on a string with your cleaning kit-use this to keep the holes free of dirt and any saddle soap, etc.
- Clean the Brass A couple of good brass products are Brasso as well as Flitz. If you clean the brass first, then the harness, you will clean off any excess brass cleaner that you do not want left on the harness.
- With a Black harness obviously use black shoe polish & buff with a
 horse hair brush. For a Russet harness, use clear Shoe polish. Care
 must be taken to not change the color of a russet harness. (If you
 want to see a lovely russet harness, visit the CAA office)
- Patent Leather Pledge or Windex to shine. Although Terry pointed out that Pledge may leave an iridescent glow to the Patent. You cannot condition Patent so be sure to watch for cracks on Patent.
- Harnesses are best stored on proper hangers that keep the shape of the harness correct. You also don't want too warm of a room as this is drying to the leather. Terry also commented that it is important to take your harness completely apart several times a year. Not only does this ensure that it is very clean but just as importantly it is the best way to examine every piece of harness in order to observe that the harness is not in need of any repairs. It was also pointed out to never dip your harness in an oil bath. This saturates the leather and you will never be able to obtain a good polish to the leather once that it has been saturated with oil. Remember, leather "breathes".

A leather harness will last many years (the Russet harness on display at CAA is over 100 years old). My first two harnesses are leather - one for every day and one for show with patent & brass. Both of these leather harnesses are over 30 years old and are still in excellent shape. I know that many of us use synthetic harness due to ease of hosing off but these harnesses also don't maintain a nice shape that is formed when using day after day on your horses or ponies. Not to mention there really is something to take pride in with a beautiful, clean properly presented leather harness. I'll also add that I did purchase a synthetic harness in 2003. Recently, my husband commented as to how good that harness looked. Well... over the years I have had to replace pieces and parts; the hip strap, the saddle, etc. So, while it does look good and I keep the harness clean it essentially has been replaced piece by piece over the past 22 years. Unlike my leather harnesses which are still original.
